

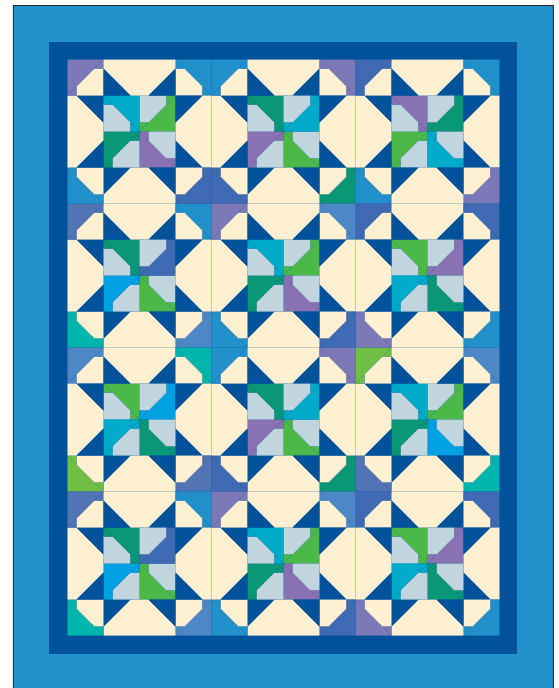
Foundation Favorites

Whether you call it foundation or paper piecing, this method of making quilt blocks is re-gaining popularity among today's quilters. Using a numbered muslin or paper pattern as a foundation, you create crisp, precisely pieced blocks. If you can sew a straight line, you can foundation piece!

Tiny triangles put a spin on this Foundation Favorites block. You'll need 8 units of Section 1 and four units of Section 2 to complete our "Columbia Puzzle." See the Piecing diagram below. Sizes given are for an 8" block. If desired, enlarge or reduce the foundation pattern for alternate sizes.



30" x 38" Quilt
(includes 1" and 2" - wide borders)

Combine "Columbia Puzzle" blocks with "Home Treasure" (also available at the QUILTMAKER web site) to create the quilt layout shown below, or make the 30" x 38" quilt shown above by placing "Columbia Puzzle" blocks in a straight setting style.
